For what it's worth...

As I am writing to all of you "Cruiser's", there is about 30" of snow sitting outside of my door. Who would even think of their classic, street rod, or muscle car at a time like this, or even consider driving it?!

So I thought it would be fun to revive the late 1960's and early 70's Chrysler Muscle Car era and discuss one of their different muscle car "groups". For those of you who do not recall this time, Chrysler had three separate, but similar, motor divisions. Chrysler, Plymouth, and Dodge. Each division had their own performance group.

In this issue I want to discuss Dodge Motor Division's "Scat Pack".

Yes, for all of you "newbies" it is the same name used today for the Dodge Challenger and some of its other related cars, but there was quite a difference back in the late 60's and 70's. Dodge was also pictured as the "Good Guy's". The one's in the white hats....A.K.A. the Dodge Boys. They even had a Sheriff in their T.V. ads who would always say....."you in a heap of trouble now"..... In Dodge's stable of cars, they had three basic body styles. The Coronet, Dart, and Charger. Each had their own variety of performance "brethren" or "wolves in sheep's clothing" that depended upon the wallet of the potential buyer.

Available performance engines were:

340 c.i. @ 275 h.p. / 383 c.i. @ 335 h.p. / 440 c.i. @ 375 h.p. / 440 w-3 2-barrel carbs @ 390 h.p. / 426 Hemi @ 425 h.p. All of the engines were not available in every body style.

As an example, in 1969 the Dodge Dart came as a GT or GTS with either a 340, 383, or 440 (yes, for 1969 the 440 was available as a factory option)

The '69 Coronet could come as an R/T or Super Bee with the "rumble" stripe. The performance engines available were the 383, 440, 440 "SixPack", and the 426 Hemi. Super Bees sporting the 440 with 3, 2-barrels also came with the famous fiberglass hood and "Six Pack" scoop along with other per-formance upgrades like a Dana 60 series rear differential. If you have been watching the auctions on television, you know these cars continue to rise in value.



"THE CURVE"

Kip's Tech Tip - by Kip Kurzmann

Ignition curves (the advance) and why they are important...

or almost 50 years I have been 'setting up ' distributors for race car, street machine, and muscle car enthusiasts and it still amazes me how many do not understand why every car has different ignition timing and advance curve requirements. Hopefully, this month's tip will shed some light on why it is so critical to a car's performance.......

First, there are three parts of an ignition distributors timing. They are the initial timing, mechanical advance, and the vacuum advance. The initial timing is what is established when the car is at idle. It can be as little as 4 degrees or as advanced as 20 degrees.

Next, is the 'Total Advance'. Total advance is the sum of the initial timing and the mechanical advance in the distributor. The way to arrive at a total advance number takes into consideration the cars weight, size of engine, compression ratio, type of combustion chamber, the stall speed of the converter if it is an automatic transmission car, rear differential ratio, the diameter of the rear tire, carburetor size, cam specifications...etc. This is why any off-the-shelf performance distributor might not work for your car's particular application.

Once you have arrived at a total advance number (using all of the information above), you need to set "the speed" at which the mechanical advance comes in when driving or racing the car. This is done by using various distributor weights and springs to either bring the 'curve' in faster or slower, depending upon your application.

In today's computer age the new 'direct' ignition engines can use a laptop to develop the proper curve for a car. All of the variables which I mentioned above are usually in the program. You just need to add your specific type of car and how you plan to use it....thank you and Happy Cruising.









for ourselves is a much more valuable endeavor and that appreciation comes in ways not limited to plastic cups.







The Automotive World Returned to Carlisle for Spring Carlisle 2022

A Mix of Nice Weather, Well Stocked Vendors, and Dedicated Guests Powered the Annual Gathering



For the first time since 2019, the Carlisle PA Fairgrounds and Spring Carlisle welcomed automotive enthusiasts from around the world with the return of international event attendees. This year's event, presented by eBay Motors, did just that and then some as guests and vendors alike flocked to Carlisle between April 20-24, 2022 to buy, sell and trade all things automotive. Spring Carlisle was one part commerce and one part social gathering; as has been the case since 1977. It once again served as THE event to jump-start the outdoor events season in Carlisle!

What was obvious early was the amount of vendors eager to re-connect with one another and the demand that their offerings have within the hobby. Cruising the grounds in advance of the April 20 start date, vendors were

mixing and mingling with one another, catching up, buying and selling amongst each other, and otherwise getting ready for the big event. When the gates opened at 7 a.m. on Wednesday, their advanced planning and hard work paid off, as throngs of enthusiasts converged on Carlisle.

Car parts, merchandise, memorabilia, collectibles, and more were coming and going all day, every day. Cars and trucks were even finding new garages to call home as business was booming in all corners of the 82-acre facility. In 2022, there were more vendors, more tickets sold, and more people at Carlisle than there were in 2021; a year that was record-breaking for Carlisle Events.

As noted in the opening headline, the automotive world did indeed return to Carlisle. Canadian guests were back in full force, so were those trekking to the Cumberland Valley from "across the pond." Every face had a smile on it at Carlisle and the next generation of the hobby was also on-site in full force, especially on Saturday where kids were out of school and families were off work.

Speaking of kids, Spring Carlisle welcomed the York County School of Technology to the stage area as they hosted exhibition runs in front of their Hot Rodders of Tomorrow championship competition in the days following event weekend. Multiple teams of schoolaged enthusiasts tore down and re-built a Chevy small block engine. The competition is done against the clock and per certain criteria put in place by the Hot Rodders organization. From their first run to their last, they had a crowd cheering them on, asking questions, and taking photos of them in action.

The stage area was actually a popular spot for guests throughout Spring Carlisle. On it were members of the AACA Car Club. They returned to Carlisle to showcase cool cars from the club, solicit for new members, and promote their upcoming fall meet in Her-



shey. While the AACA was on the stage, the ARMO Hot Products Showcase was in front of it. ARMO brought some of the hottest NEW products on the market to the masses at Carlisle. ARMO is a council of SEMA, which is a private industry trade event held each fall in November. For most guests, this ARMO display gives them a first-hand/in-person look at ways to better their prized ride.

One of the best parts about Spring Carlisle 2022 was the giving nature of those who walked through the gates. Through a joint effort between Carlisle Events, the Salvation Army, and multiple local Lions Clubs, over \$3,000 was raised for Ukrainian Humanitarian relief efforts. That total includes a company donation made by Carlisle Events, plus in person donations by those attending Spring Carlisle. Best of all, at least two generous attendees dropped \$100 in the bin. That kind of support goes a long way to helping those in need and will continue throughout the 2022 season.

Another great element of Spring Carlisle was the two-day classic and collector car auction hosted by Carlisle Auctions (more soon). The Spring Carlisle Collector Car Auction tallied \$6.5 million in sales (including fees) and can boast a 72% sell-through rate. The auction even had its own charitable venture, with several thousand dollars raised for veterans at the James E. Van Zandt VA Medical Center in Altoona, Pennsylvania.

While Spring Carlisle is a wrap for 2022, Carlisle Events sets its sights on the next event, plus next year's spring show. Up next at the fairgrounds is the annual international showcase of cars and trucks as part of the Carlisle Import & Performance Nationals (May 13-14). As Spring Carlisle 2023 goes, the event is planned for April 19-23, with the auction happening April 20-21. Complete details on all things car show related, including the ability to buy spectator tickets in advance at a discounted rate can be found at CarlisleEvents. com.

The Spring Carlisle Collector Car Auction Delivers an Event for the Ages in April of 2022

72% Sell-Through Rate, \$6.5 Million in Sales, and MANY Happy Auction Guests

In the days leading up to the 2022 Spring Carlisle Collector Car Auction, there was optimism by many that this event just might be the best Spring auction ever. That hope became a reality and then some as hundreds of bidders converged online and in-person for the auction, helping send 72% of all available lots home to new owners, while tallying \$6.5 million in sales (includes fees).

For two days (April 21-22, 2022), plus multiple preview opportunities leading up to it, the Carlisle Expo Center became a mecca for those looking for their first or next classic. 400+ lots were anticipated, which included enough trucks to fill a themed hour on Thursday, April 21; plus 100 years of confirmed consignments. With rides spanning 1923 to 2022, there was literally something for everyone and just about everyone at the event were able to find what they needed.

From the first smack of the gavel on April 21 to the final hammer to fall on April 22, the interior of the Expo Center and its adjoining parking lot were hopping. The roar of the engines, the smell of car care products; it was a true sensory experience.

In addition to all the senses that were piqued throughout, the auction benefitted charity too. According to Tony Cline, Director of Auction Operations, "several thousand dollars were raised for veterans at the James E. Van Zandt VA Medical Center in Altoona, Pennsylvania."

It turns out that not only was this auction fun for all involved, it goes down as THE BEST Carlisle Auctions event of all-time – not just an all-timer for Spring, but for any Carlisle auction. The 72% sell-through rate and \$6.5 million in sales (with fees) are the best

numbers to ever come out of an auction. Along with the in-person sales, at least 30 cars sold online too, meaning the fun was not only available to those at Carlisle, but to those on a PC around the world.

The top five (5) selling cars totaled nearly \$360,000, with Thursday's top seller being the '67 Corvette, while the Oldsmobile 442 convertible was tops for Friday. The top five (5) are as follows:

- 1) 1971 Oldsmobile 442 Convertible \$100,440
- 2) 1969 Camaro \$85,320
- 3) 1934 Ford 5 Window \$83,160
- 4) 1967 Corvette \$81,500
- 5) 1965 Tiger Sunbeam \$81,000

If the cars were hot, trucks were even hotter. On April 21 starting at about 4 p.m. an all-truck hour took over the Expo Center. This 60-minute window of time saw dozens of trucks cross the block, with 80% of them selling.

"Thank you to all of the buyers and sellers that helped make the Spring Carlisle Auction the most successful auction that we've ever produced," noted Tony Cline. "We could not do what we do without our buyers and sellers in person and online. I can't wait to welcome everyone back to Carlisle for our next car auction, September 29-30, 2022 as part of Fall Carlisle," continued Cline. We are actively taking consignments today and registering bidders for the event."

Carlisle Events is a partner or producer of over a dozen annual collector car/truck events. Events are held at the Carlisle PA Fairgrounds (Carlisle, PA), Allentown Fairgrounds (Allentown, PA) and the SUN 'n FUN Expo Campus (Lakeland, FL). The season schedule includes five automotive flea markets of varying size, multiple auctions, as well as individual specialty shows featuring Corvettes, Fords, GMs, Chryslers, trucks, imports, tuners and performance sport compacts. Reader's Rides

Dave Kluck's '55 Willys Aero "Bermuda"

My dad opened a Willys (that's Will-is, not Will-eze) dealership in 1952 in New Ulm, Minnesota. Prior to '52, the brand was known as the original mass producer of the military Jeep, and later, Jeep trucks, station wagons and the Jeepster. The Bantam company in PA gets credit for the first Jeep prototype, but it didn't have the capacity to meet the military's production needs.

In 1952 Wiilys introduced the Aero passenger

car, their first since 1942. The Aero was very stylish, and I can remember alot of showroom traffic for this new, "compact" car. Dad sold quite a few Aeros along with large numbers of Jeep products. The top of the line Aero featured a 6-cylinder F Head engine which has the intake valves in the head, and the exhaust valves in the block. Despite it's small, 161 cu. in., 90-hp engine, it





performed very well because of the larger intake valves. (The CJ Jeep used a 4-cylinder version of this from 1954 until the 1970s.)

The Aero only lasted from 52 to '55, with a total production of 100,000 cars. By the late 50's, my dad had closed his dealership for a management position with Caterpillar.

I left Minnesota in 1968 to join the Army. After 21 years in the

Army, my wife and I settled in BelAir where I could start my antique car hobby. The influence of the Willys Aero in my youth was strong, because I've had 5 of them. I currently have this 'Bermuda' 2-door hardtop, and a rare, '54 Ace Deluxe 4-door sedan with right hand drive. I imported the rust-free car from Capetown, South Africa and, like the Aeros, is completely restored. There were only 2,100 Bermudas in this last year of production. I also have a '55 Willys Custom parts car.

My 1950 Willy Jeepster is my hot rod; also a full restoration, but it is now powered by a stock Ford 302 V8 and C4 automatic trans.
