



Jerry Wagner BOOM -\$500 utterly necessary to pull off the yard sale. Many thanks to them for what they have already done and what they will do.





Carlisle Chrysler Nationals Weekend Sets New Show Car Record

Annual Mopar Event Tops 3,000 Cars for the First Time Ever -Sold Out Vending Too


For years, Mopar enthusiasts have flocked to the Carlisle Chrysler Nationals and annually, each show seems to top its predecessor. While new Showfield records have been a near annual

occurrence for this event, one number has eluded its participants: 3,000! Wait no longer, as not only did this year's event (July 15-17) at the Carlisle PA Fairgrounds set a new Showfield mark for the second straight year, but it also finally topped 3,000...3,101 to be exact. Powered by guests from around the world, this show truly was one for the ages.

With favorable weather throughout the weekend, Thursday's set up day (July 14) seemed more like a show day. In fact, by 4 p.m. the neighboring Carlisle Expo Center's parking lot was packed as the Mopar Rebellion Car Club hosted its kick-off party. This event within the event grows annually and is free for spectators and participants alike. Mix this in with the early bird fairgrounds access for parts shopping and it's easy to see why the world's largest all-Mopar themed show got off to such a great start.

Gates opened at 7 a.m. Friday but before the official start time, show cars were rolling on grounds and spectators were lined up waiting to check out the displays and get their first interactions with the variety of special guests, including Cristy Lee, Herb McCandless, Paul Rossi, the Ramchargers, Golden Commandos, Miss Direct Connection 1984, Claudia Abel, and more. While many of those guests had a chance to get on grounds and meet the early attendees, they also stood front and center at 10 a.m. as part of the event's State of the Hobby Address. For more than an hour, the panel spoke on what the hobby has meant to them, what they do in it and how important a car show like this is to owners and attendees alike. Further, a handful of cars were unveiled at the stage, including one from ExoMod; a 1968 Charger carbon fiber body, positioned atop a brand new 2021 Challenger Hellcat Redeye.

The Friday morning gathering helped usher in a full day of autograph signings from many of the aforementioned guests. It was also a day filled with sensory delights, including amazing smells from the food court and Showfield alike. Dodge had guests on edge all day with their thrill rides, plus the foot traffic at their midway display served as a reminder to them how important and popular they are to the hobby



On Saturday, the line of cars rolling on grounds started early and lasted until mid-day. Cristy Lee was back on stage as well as a special presentation from Mopar's Mad Men, Jim Ramsey and Joe Schulte, the marketing guys responsible for the famous ads coming out of the '60s era muscle car magazines. Along with them were McCandless and Buddy Martin (of Sox and Martin fame).

Saturday also included an all-new rolling burnout and donut contest. The fun took place on the track in front of a packed audience and opened with an exhibition from Dodge. What happened next wowed the crowd, as trucks and cars of all eras participated, culminating in a win by a Massachusetts attendee and his 1969 Charger.

The record setting show didn't just include cars and trucks on display, there was an entire display and parade showcasing Mopar collectibles. This included bikes, a snow sled, driving simulator, video games, Richard Petty Lawnmowers, and more.

The fun concluded Sunday with one last pass through the displays, some rides with Dodge and a two-hour awards parade that included a photo opportunity with Cristy Lee. While 2022 has concluded, guests and event planning staff are already looking forward to next year. Save the date, because the 2023 Carlisle Chrysler Nationals are July 14-16 and include displays focused on the Malaise Era, High School Mopars, and more. are Becoming... a Broken Record at Carlisle in 2022

Carlisle Truck Nationals Presented by A&A Auto Stores
Nearly Touches the 2,600 Truck Mark

The Carlisle Truck Nationals presented by A&A Auto Stores has been taking place at the Carlisle PA Fairgrounds since 1991. During that time, participation has fluctuated, with the occasional new Showfield record being set. What's occurred for this event spanning the last ten years and more so the last two, has been nothing short of amazing. Dating back to 2013, this gathering of all things truck has more than doubled and in 2022 (August 5-7), a new Showfield record was set with 2,595 registered rides, including a new record of 213 big rigs as part of the Big Rig Show and Shine. This is the second consecutive year a truck Showfield record was set and overall, the event has seen a nearly 900 truck increase since 2019.

Gates opened at 7 a.m. daily for families, truck owners, and truck lovers from the region to enjoy all that the event had to offer. This included a low truck "skate parade," tractor parade, multiple competitions for drivers, and displays indoors and out that featured some of the coolest trucks on the planet. Many first-time participants marveled at the diverse make up of the Showfield; from tractors to mini trucks, cool custom vans to fire trucks, lifted monsters to chopped originals, the event really had it all. There were even parts shopping options within the automotive flea market and midway, plus installs by way of A&A Auto Stores

In addition, the Monster Truck showcase with Diehl Wilson and his crew packed the grandstands for multiple shows between Friday and Sunday. Wilson, known for his time piloting the Virginia Giant, served as host to rides with his truck, plus emcee as Full Boar and Bad News Travels Fast soared through the air and crushed cars. Further, there were motorcycle stunt shows with Freestyle FMX riders and Moto Motion riders too. The freestyle riders soared through the area showcasing their daredevil skills, while Moto Motion's riders used their trials bikes to exhibit amazing balance and showoff some stunts of their own.

On the Big Rig side of things, not only were the trucks on display, but companies were onsite hiring and looking to fill out staffing needs. Jobs didn't just involve driving or having a CDL.

Companies like Lily, NAPA Transportation, S&H Express, New Enterprise Stone & Lime Company, Inc., NHH Services, Inc., FIT Transportation, and UPS were on site also looking to hire dock workers and other staff for their warehouses.

Rigs also served as the backdrop and soundtrack for Saturday's Carlisle after dark showcase. This evening celebration included a drop and drag contest by the low trucks, a laughter and fun filled party with the Vanners, and the Big Rig glow show. The glow show allows guests a chance to check out the cool light displays, interiors, and sounds of the rides that help move America.

There were a trifecta of locations spotlighting displays too. This included Building Y (SyTys at Carlisle), Building T (S10's, antique fire trucks, and featured display trucks), plus the pavilion (Vanarama 10). Finally, the S10 got a little extra love at Carlisle in 2022, with a two-show spotlight as part of its 40th anniversary (also featured at the Carlisle GM Nationals in June).

While the Carlisle Truck Nationals have concluded for 2022, many owners and guests are making plans for 2023. This includes vendors who saw much success within the automotive flea market and show truck owners who were part of the record setting Showfield. Planning is already underway for the 2023 show, so save the date. The Carlisle Truck Nationals presented by A&A Auto Stores returns to Carlisle August 4-6! Well fortunately for one lucky person it becomes reality though **Motorama Productions** show series annually. **Motorama Productions** event series has partnered with M2 Machines, one of the diecast industries premier collectible brands. That's right someone's real show vehicle gets turned into a diecast car or truck every year thanks to the amazing design team at M2. Could your ride be next?

The competition runs the full calendar year. At every show **Motorama Productions** host, their staff picks four vehicles from those in attendance that fit the criteria M2 Machines presented for the partnership. Im-


















































Reader's Rides

If the weather is nice, Don uses the VW for daily transportation. Good thing he is now retired, stopping by the 7-11 or bank probably takes twice as long, as everyone wants to stop and chat.
