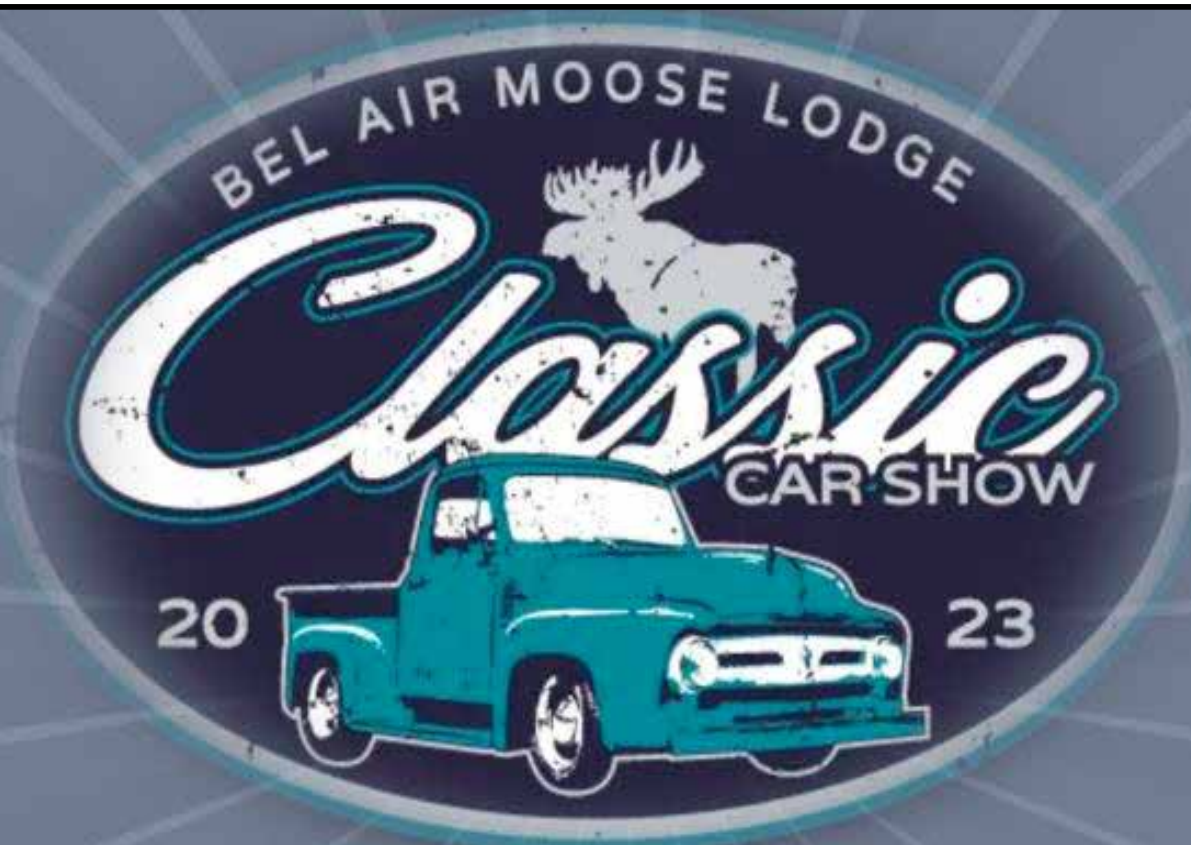

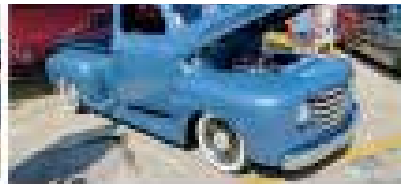

The return of the new and improved Real Man's Yard Sale is coming quickly on August 5. If you've been living under a rock and haven't heard, we are moving up to the Markets at Shrewsbury, so that we might realize our true growth potential. Dave and I tried desperately to find a venue in Harford County to no avail. The Markets at Shrewsbury offers us a ton of space for sellers as well as parking for buyers. Of course the sideline benefit is the outstanding food that's available inside of the market. Spaces will be typical 10 x 20 for \$25 paid before July 16th, \$30 after.

fee yourself, that would be wonderful! Dave is including a copy of the registration form on the facing page for you non-techies to use. Fill it out in its entirety and forward it to the address indicated along with your payment. We are looking forward to an incredibly successful event... We hope to see you there!

I've mentioned before that there are some clubs in the area that have committed funds to the foundation from the proceeds of their car shows. The Chesapeake region of the AACA, the Buick owners of Maryland and the Freestate region of the Vintage Chevrolet Club of America are all hosting events in the very near future. You will find their listings here in the magazine, so please make it a point

to attend those events and help do your part to make their event successful and to also indirectly, donate to the CCCEF.

Don't forget that the CCCEF hosts a cruise at the Harford Vineyard and Winery on the third Saturday of each month. It's absolutely free, so there's no reason not to come. 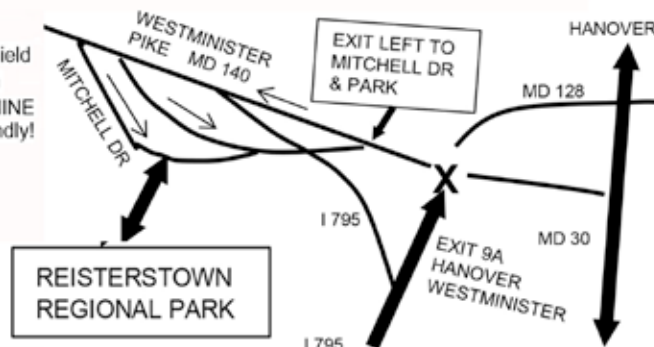

Reader's Rides

Bob Holt's 1961 Corvair rampside truck.

This truck was bought as a total basket case on eBay, and I had it shipped from Washington state to Maryland. It took a total of 4 years on and off to restore. All body panels were hand forged by me, as only some fiberglass were available. The rampside trucks were built from 1961-1964 and then discontinued. They were delivery vehicles primarily, with a 6 cylinder piston-opposed boxer air cooled engine. It has a payload of 3/4 ton, and the side swing-down gate can take 1000 pounds which made it great for loading. These are also known as "FCs" which means forward control. The Corvair 95 emblem refers to the 95 in. wheel base. I added a few upgrades like an American racing steering wheel, carpet, modified engine lid, automatic transmission, and custom two-tone base/clear paint job. The thing is a blast to drive. and they will make you a rock star as they are unusual and definitely head turners.

Best Ford Nationals Event Since 2014 Powers a Stellar Car Show Weekend in Carlisle

The combination of Show Cars, Special Unveilings, Vendors, and More Draw Thousands of Ford Lovers

Passionate! That one word and ten letters is the best way to describe and summarize those who attend and/or participate in the world's largest all-Ford-themed car show; the Carlisle Ford Nationals. The 2023 offering presented by eBay Motors (June 2-4) became the second-largest Ford Nationals ever and did so in more than one way. Of course, the all-time Showfield mark was set in 2022, but this year's total of 3,434 show cars, combined with a stellar vendor and spectator turnout means that since 2014, this was THE largest gathering of Ford lovers at the Carlisle PA Fairgrounds.

Now, why did all these blue oval lovers migrate to Carlisle? Where does one begin? Maybe it was the two-dozen new product walkarounds from industry experts being executed two and sometimes three times an hour, or the half a dozen or so new vehicle unveilings. It could have also been the special guests, unique displays, competitions, parades, and of course parts shopping within the automotive flea market. The reality is, it was all of that...and more.

Friday, June 2 included a special one-day-only visit by two-time Formula Drift Champion and professional fun-haver Vaughn Gittin, Jr. Vaughn and his RTR Vehicles team came to Carlisle to showcase their new fleet of vehicles, meet fans, sign autographs, and have some drifting fun on the Carlisle track. In addition, another automotive giant, Steve Saleen, made Carlisle home for the weekend. Steve and his team showcased a handful of Saleen customized rides, including the amazing S7 and an all-new SA-40 Mustang, including one that supports a charitable cause. Steve was also part of a special Friday evening dinner and auction that benefited the Chip Miller Amyloidosis Foundation.

2023 featured displays included the annual Ford Nationals Select in Building Y, plus a mix of Saleens, Lightnings, SVTs, the Coyote Den, Malaise Era cars, and more mixed between Building T and special display tents on the grounds.

Ford Performance was well represented by its team members, including the likes of Jim Owens, John Clor, Carl Widmann, and Arie Groneveld just to name a few. Each had a little something to showcase to the masses. For Owens, it was a trio of Mustangs, including the Dark Horse, the Eco-Boost, and one with an all-new GT performance package. Widmann and Groneveld had the honor of presenting for the first time at an enthusiast event, the Ranger Raptor truck, plus brought the F-150 Raptor, and Bronco Raptor with them too.



Meanwhile, Clor presented some talks on the SVT, while also honoring Venom Invasion, the event's coolest club.

Further love of Ford branded products came from Kyle Sargent of Ford Performance Racing Parts as well as Gary Patterson and Tracey Smith from Shelby American. Sargent showcased a pair of 700+ HP F-150s, while the Shelby leadership not only introduced but also reopened production of the Shelby Dragonsnake with its former driver Bruce Larson, while also pulling the covers off a pair of Centennial Edition trucks on the Carlisle stage. KTL Restorations also got in on the walk-around game, showcasing their award-winning 1970 Aruba Eliminator two different times as amazed showgoers looked on.

The wheels were in motion at Carlisle, not only from Gittin, Jr. drift exhibitions, but from rides via Gateway Mustang, the Real Street Shootout (autocross), a rolling exhaust contest, rolling burnouts and donuts presented by Atturo Tires, on-grounds parades, monster truck rides from the Virginia Giant, and the Ford Downtown Parade, Park and Party.

As the final hours of the 2023 event concluded, awards were posted and presented to those who were available to receive them, while others celebrated the success of the weekend with late-day photos and even some open autocross runs on the Carlisle track.

While 2023 is a wrap, the Carlisle Ford Nationals 2024 is in the planning stages and taking place May 31-June 2. Registration for it is now open and planned 2024 display themes include 60 Years of the Mustang, including a gallery of legendary and historically significant Mustangs, a Mustang production timeline, a Y-Block Reunion, 40 Years of the SVO, 50 Years of the Mustang II, and the annual Ford Nationals Select display. For details on upcoming car events at Carlisle, advanced arrival information, or to check out the winner's list and photos from Ford Nationals weekend, visit CarlisleEvents.com.

Carlisle Events is a partner or producer of over a dozen annual collector car/truck events. Events are held at the Carlisle PA Fairgrounds (Carlisle, PA), Allentown Fairgrounds (Allentown, PA), and the SUN 'n FUN Expo Campus (Lakeland, FL). The season schedule includes automotive flea markets of varying sizes, multiple auctions, as well as individual specialty shows featuring Corvettes, Fords, GMs, Chryslers, trucks, imports, tuners, and performance sport compacts. Founded in 1974 by friends Bill Miller and Chip Miller, events hosted at Carlisle attract enthusiasts annually from all corners of the globe. 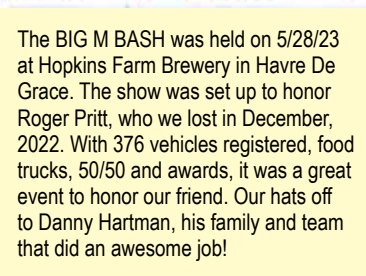

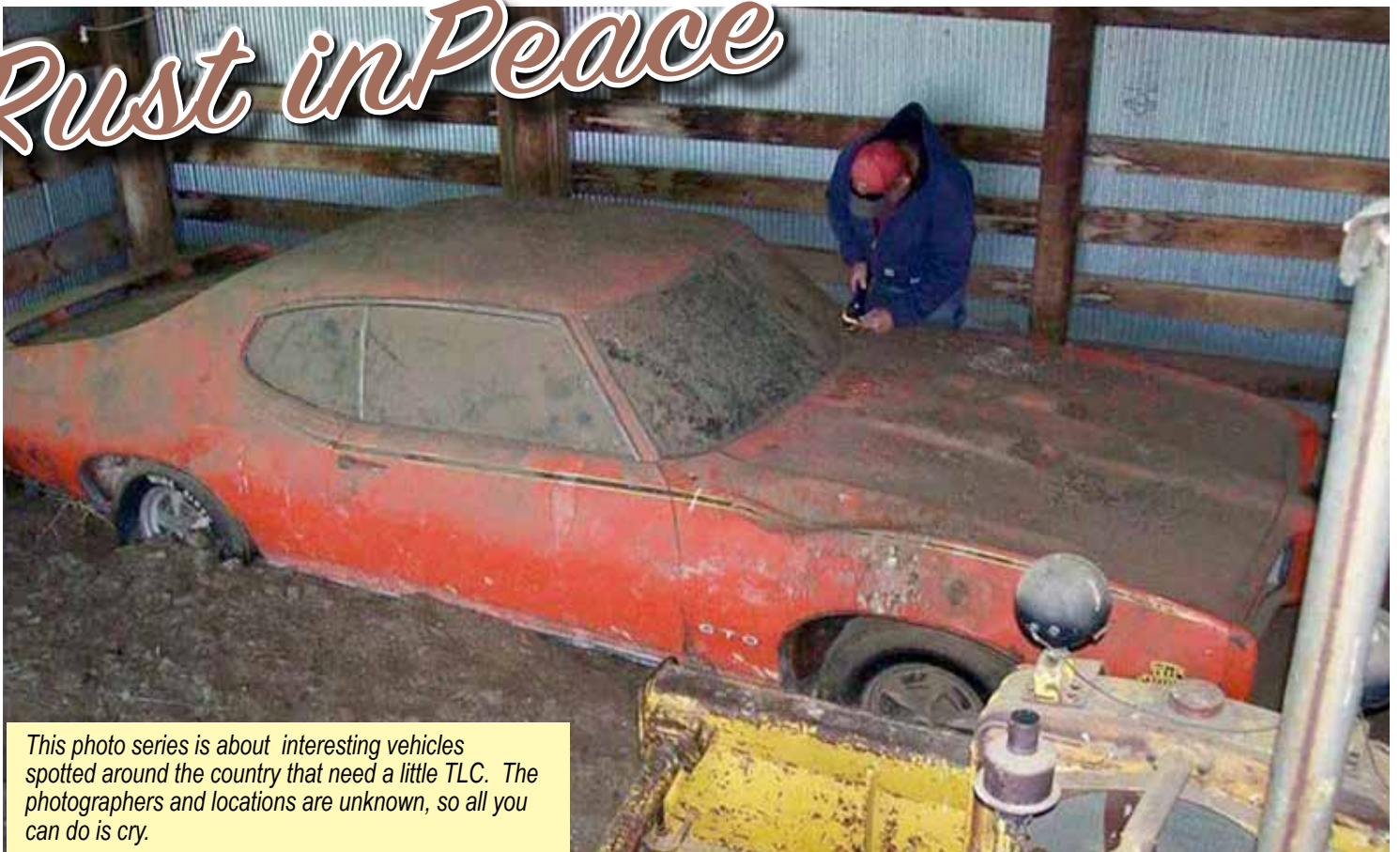

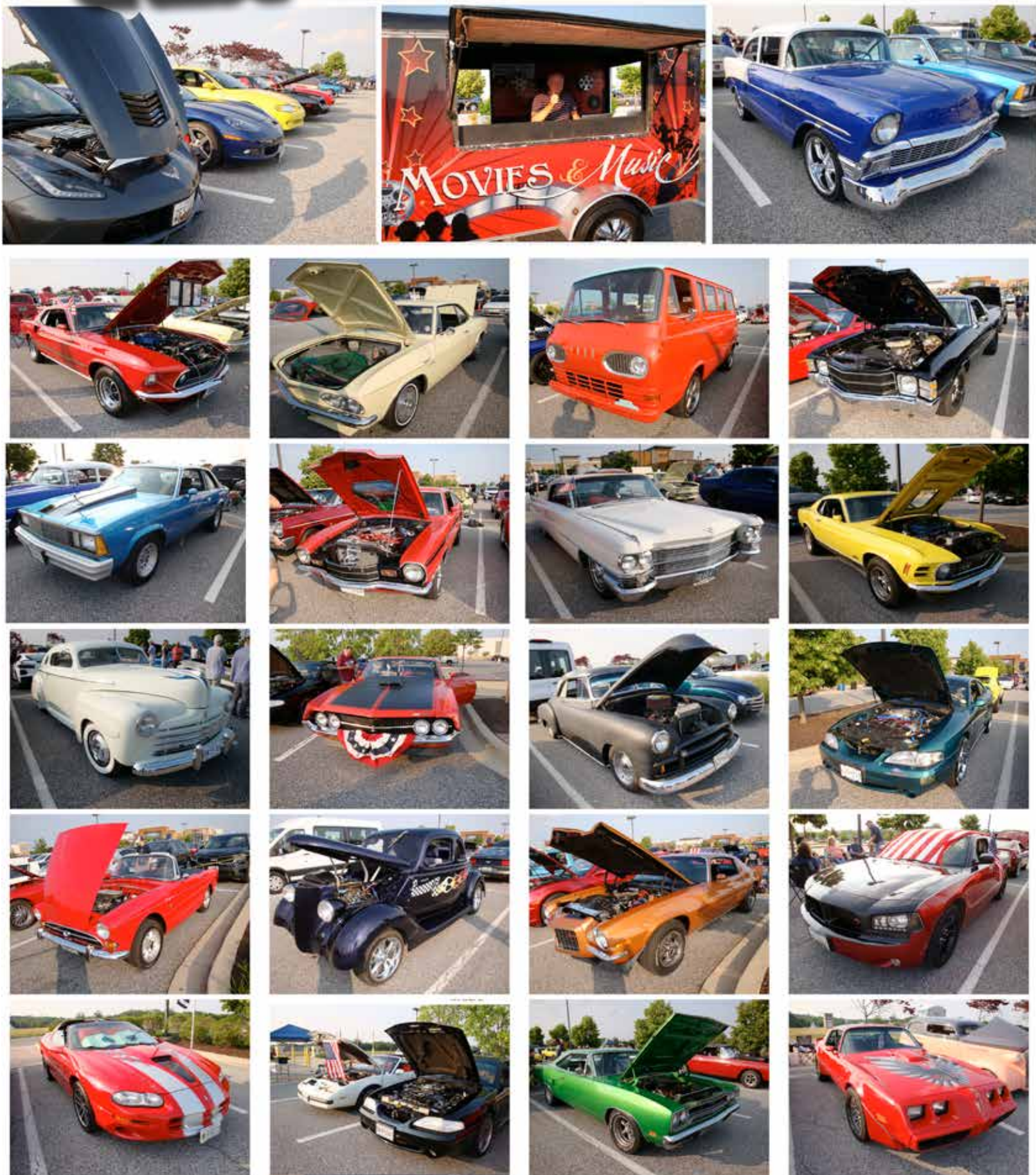

Goodman's Garage Makeover

with Andy and Alyssa Goodman

Every car guy (and gal) wants a special place to keep their 4-wheel friends safe, protected, and out of harm's way from the outdoor elements. A garage that suits one's own style is an extension of themselves. Decorating the walls with banner, signs, maybe cabinets, and a nice toolbox all adds to the décor. What really sets off a cool garage space, what finishes the area, is what flooring finish one chooses. Though there are many ways to finish a garage floor, going with an epoxy coating gives your space a whole new look and feel, plus unmatched durability paired with countless available options. There are some good DIY kits out there that will last you several years. If you want the best for your garage there are companies out there that will lay down an industrial grade epoxy floor in your residential garage complete with a lifetime transferable homeowner warranty.

After doing much homework on companies performing this work in the Mid-Atlantic region, I selected to work with Epoxy Floor Experts. I took the time to do a bit of homework reading reviews and studying their reputation online. Next, I had a representative come out to do a site review, make suggestions, and come up with a plan that would best suit my needs and wants. Upon my Hancock on the contract, I had a month to clear everything out of the garage for them to get started (and as everyone knows by now, my garage is packed floor to ceiling with model cars, so the clean out was no easy task).



The garage was emptied out and ready for the professionals to do their thing.



With D-day here the team of young men started off by Diamond cutting the entire 950sq foot concrete floor with industrial machines and smaller handheld versions to get in all the small and tight places.

After vacuuming up the remaining dust and edging everything with tape, the team mixed up the flexible crack weld and filled in all cracks, chips, and any other imperfections that stood out to them.



The next step was to roll on the Epoxy coating making sure to get every inch of the floor coated.



Leaving a bit of time for the Epoxy to set next, the crew hand spread 150lbs of "Wombat" colored flake directly onto the epoxy; covering all the Epoxy base coat to a point that not an open spot could be found.

Next was to remove all the excess metallic flake material that did not adhere to the epoxy coating.



The crew then removed the edging tape only to retape everything once again. When asked why retape, they explained that some of the flakes will stick to the tape, and that by retaping they can ensure perfect edges for the topcoats.



The final step in the process was two layers of anti-skid topcoat to seal everything in, so the garage could get that final shine.



After allowing all to cure for 72 hours I was able to get started in re-hanging the model car collection. Here is a look at the final product

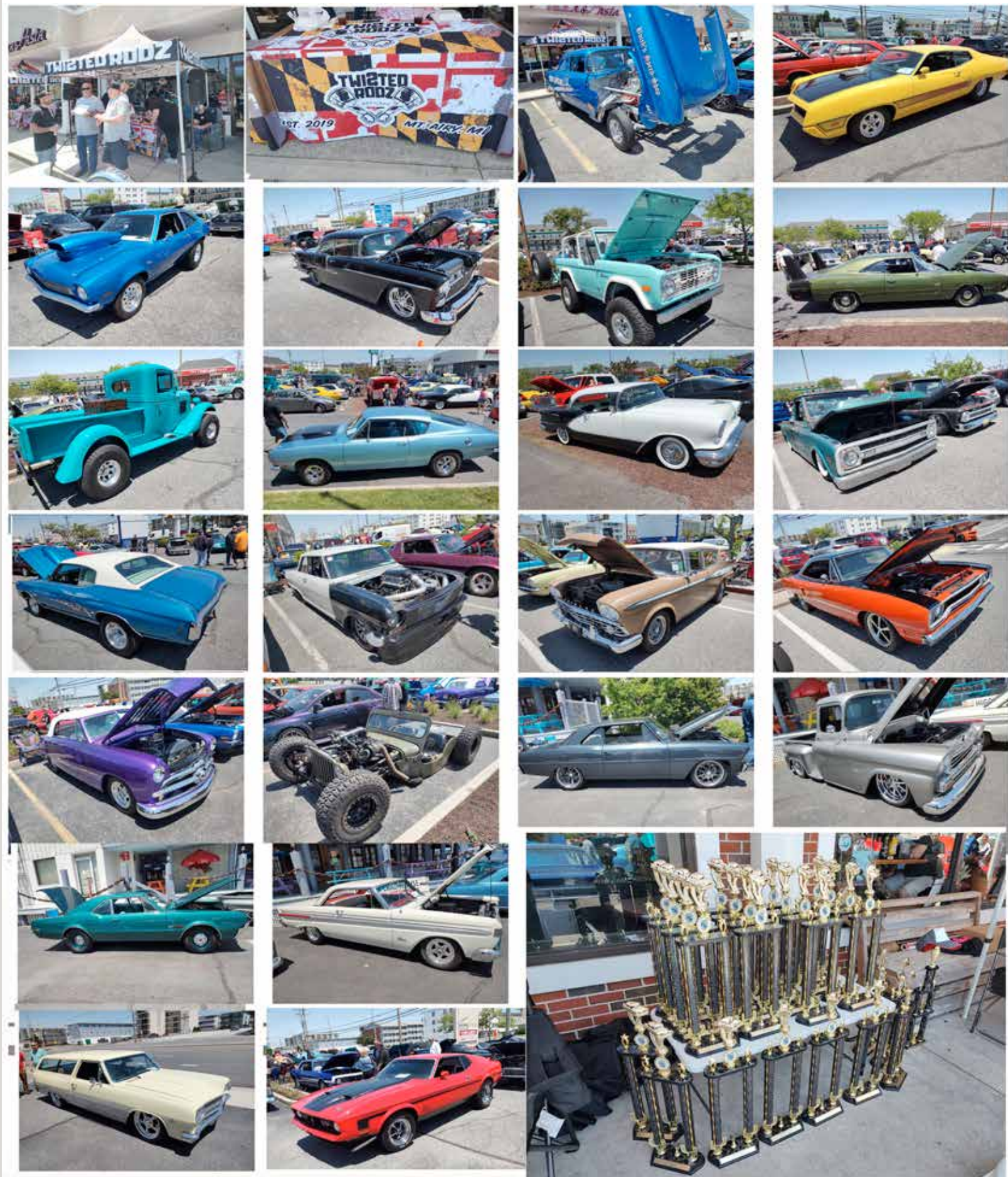

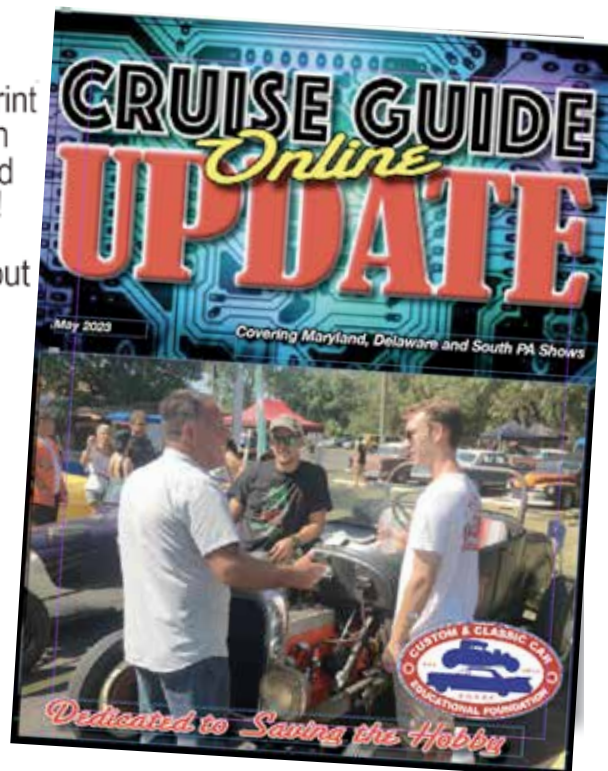
