Courtney Cavin's '49 Plymouth Suburban Wagon

Courtney Cavin, now the owner of a '49 Plymouth Suburban Wagon, has had a lot to learn since it became hers last spring. Bart Cavin, her father, has been teaching and helping her with everything he can. With his help, Courtney is able to keep a family legacy on the road.



How we found it!

Built in the late 80s by her grandfather, Ken Cavin Sr., the wagon has its own story. Pulled from the woods, the '49 Plymouth Wagon was a shell of a rusty car. Despite laughter and disbelief from friends and family, Ken went ahead with his plans, completely disassembling and discarding the chassis. In its place a new frame, new floors, rack-and-pinion steering, and Lincoln 9" rear were added, all done in Ken's garage with the help of a lot of friends. On to the body, the hood was shaved, the headlights recessed, and a BASF 85

Garnet Red paint job was added. To stay true to its Plymouth roots it is powered by a 1957 392 Hemi. Ken enjoyed the car for many years; it was featured in the December issue of Hot Rod magazine in '91. In order to expand his business, Ken parted ways with the car in 1996. In 2004, in celebration of Ken's 25th year in business, his three children located the wagon in Georgia, providing the ultimate surprise gift for him. Remarkably not much had changed, new front tires was about it. Over the years, updates were made to include new interior and updated wheels. Fast forward to last spring, where Courtney was able to keep the car in the family, becoming the new owner. Due to spending a lot of time learning the art of polishing, the 30-year-old paint and build look pretty darn good.

The wagon has been on the road more in the last year than it had been in the past decade. Bart and Courtney are looking forward to taking it to even more shows this year and to seeing friends who were part of this build three decades ago.
